## Communicating with Kanaki

1 in 10 children will experience a speech delay per the American Academy of Family Physicians

Kanaki is a bright and precocious four-year-old little boy who attends school at our Bartow campus. Born at 40 weeks, he was full-term and an easy baby, sleeping through the night by the time he was 3 months old. His infancy was remarkable as he achieved milestones early, sitting up unassisted at 6 months old and walking at 10 months of age. He was a happy and engaging little boy: the complete apple of his parents' eyes.

When Kanaki was 18 months, his parents noticed he wasn't talking and wouldn't maintain eye contact or point to objects. His parents made sure to discuss this at his 24-month appointment with their pediatrician, who felt that the speech delay was due to Kanaki being raised in a multilingual home, where English, Spanish, and Greek are all spoken.

Kanaki started attending a daycare in the summer of 2021. His mother shared her concerns with his teacher and asked her to be attentive to anything that seemed unusual. His teacher observed the same behaviors: Kanaki wouldn't make eye contact, would parallel play but not engage with his friends in class, and didn't respond to his name. At this point, while Kanaki could identify the alphabet, count, and understand three languages, he was not able to express himself verbally and seemed to have no words at all. Jessica enrolled him in private speech therapy and scheduled an evaluation with a neurologist, who confirmed and validated their concerns about Kanaki's development.

Kanaki's Early Steps provider and the family's

special needs support group all recommended they explore Achievement Academy for Kanaki's Pre-K education; they decided to apply and checked the boxes to accept placement at any of the three campus locations. Receiving the call that Kanaki had a place at the Bartow campus was both terrifying that it wouldn't be a good fit yet exciting to imagine the ways Achievement Academy could help their child achieve his goals.

His mother describes enrolling Kanaki in Achievement Academy as the best decision they could have made. He currently receives individual Speech and Occupational Therapies to work towards his personal goals. Miss Cathy, his Speech Therapist, has introduced a voice output device into their sessions since Kanaki is still working to use words to communicate with others. The iPad has a special app that speaks when a picture is touched, allowing him to express his wants and needs through this assistive technology. His hard work in Occupational Therapy is paying off, as he continues to make progress and hone his fine motor skills.

Today, Kanaki and his family couldn't be happier to be at Achievement Academy and they can't wait to see how he will continue to grow!



#### **Benefiting from Both Programs!**

Sawyer had the opportunity to receive home visits through our Birth to Three Early Intervention program after being referred to Achievement Academy by USF Early Steps. Miss Tina, one of our Infant Toddler Development Specialists, worked with Sawyer to engage her in activities that would promote her development towards appropriate goals.

Sawyer's Birth to Three sessions truly became an activity for the whole family, with her parents, grandparents, and older brothers all helping Sawyer master various skills. She was extremely motivated by her brothers, often completing tasks for them that she resisted doing for others.



In August, Sawyer started her Pre-K journey as a student in Miss Laura's classroom. She loves circle time and engaging with her friends through play. Sawyer receives individual therapy sessions as a part of her regular school day, and Miss Laura is able to reinforce Sawyer's therapy sessions in her classroom.

One activity that is a particular favorite is the saucer swing! Sitting and swinging in the saucer helps Sawyer engage and strengthen her core while she develops her balance, skills she has been working on with her Physical Therapist. To incorporate speech and language skills, Miss Laura periodically stops the swing to encourage Sawyer to communicate her desire to continue, either using her words verbally or using her sign language to request *more*.

What appears to be simple play is helping Sawyer master skills and establish a strong foundation for her continued development and education. We are honored to be a part of Sawyer's story!
