

Tiny Beginnings, Tremendous Strength: How Connection Changed Everything

New parents often make connections in a playgroup, but Jadacy and Ronda met while scrubbing in to enter the NICU at Lakeland Regional Health, where babies Maxwell and Deanna were born exactly one week apart, both at just 24 weeks gestation. With strict COVID hospital restrictions in place, visiting was limited to just parents, creating isolation in what was already a frightening experience.



Both moms were carrying the weight of fear and the unknown and quickly bonded through their experience. Together, they learned to take life one day at a time, exchanging phone numbers to talk frequently and pray

together often. Through the highs and lows of Maxwell and Deanna's nearly four-month NICU journey, their bond became a steady source of strength.

When they finally brought their babies home, both families faced new challenges - but they did not face them alone. The hospital discharge team had referred them to Achievement Academy's Birth to Three program, where their journeys continued in ways they never could have imagined. Their Early Interventionists provided love, care, and guidance in each child's development, making sure Jadacy and Ronda felt supported every step of the way. As their children grew, both Ms. Becky and Ms. Tina gently encouraged the families to consider enrolling their children in our ESE Pre-Kindergarten. The trust that had been established with their Interventionists was a key factor for both families being ready to take a leap of faith and allow someone outside of family to care for their children.

At Achievement Academy, both families discovered far more than a school. They found a community, and Maxwell and Deanna continued to thrive. Maxwell has flourished in Miss Nicole's classroom, growing in confidence and independence each day. Deanna's journey has been marked by extraordinary determination. Once facing severe feeding challenges that required intensive support, she has made remarkable progress and now eats independently, an achievement that once felt out of reach.

A cornerstone of their support system is Ms. Mary, the Resource Parent, whose impact reaches far beyond the campus. For both Jadacy and Ronda, Mary's presence and guidance have been invaluable. By sharing her own experiences and offering support without judgment, she provides encouragement not only in parenting, but in life. Monthly parent meetings further strengthen this network, reminding families they are never alone in their journey.

The impact of Achievement Academy extends into every part of family life. With Maxwell supported during the school day, Jadacy has been able to pursue her own goals, attending culinary school and building a business. For Ronda, the trust she developed with staff made it possible to confidently place Deanna in a setting where her needs would be met with both skill and compassion.

Maxwell and Deanna are not defined by the circumstances of their birth, but by the progress they continue to achieve. At the same time, Jadacy and Ronda are confident knowing their children are in expert, compassionate hands.
