We had our Charter School contract extended until 2022 and increased the number of students we can serve up to 200. The extended contract will allow us to obtain long-term financing to pay for the land and new building. At this point, we are only in the planning stages for a new building as we need to pay off the land before starting construction. We will be starting our Capital Campaign soon, so stay tuned and enjoy and support this exciting adventure!!!

When Charlie was born at 10 weeks premature she weighed only 2 pounds, 4 ounces. She literally fit in the palm, of her parent's two hands.

Charlie's journey at Achievement Academy began in our Birth to Three Program when she was just 4 months old. Each month one of our Early Interventionists, Becky Jacklin, visited her home teaching developmental activities and techniques to her parents in order to enhance Charlie's development. Equipment and developmental toys, all provided by United Way funds, were given to the family to help Charlie reach her goals.

Charlie had a rough start to life that included many obstacles to overcome. Learning to crawl and walk took much time and effort. She began to crawl at age one and by age two she had accomplished walking. Charlie is now three years old and is a shining light in her mom's eyes. Her parents truly believe that if it weren't for Achievement Academy and United Way, Charlie may have been further behind in her development.
